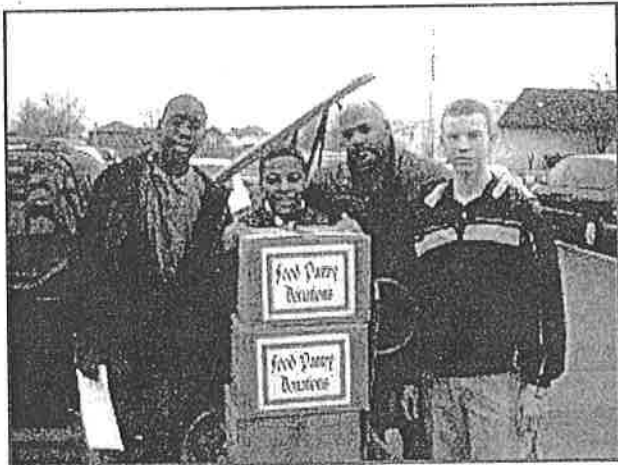
Lansing schoolchildren donate to pantry
